OVERVIEW

Elk Grove High School, home of the Grenadiers, is one of six, four-year comprehensive high schools in IL High School District 214. It includes portions of the villages of Elk Grove, Des Plaines, Mt. Prospect and Arlington Heights. Elk Grove has an ethnically diverse population made up of students that are 44% Latino, 40% White, 10% Asian, 2% Black and 3% Other. The devoted and professional staff of teachers, counselors, coaches and support staff at EG collaborate to provide a relevant, rigorous curriculum in a safe, supportive learning environment for over 2,000 students. EG's curricular program features a purposefully aligned, standards-based core course sequence coupled with a vast range of elective related to preparing students for a future in any of the 16 career clusters. Our focus is on developing students into academically successful, ethnically prudent young adults.

Elk Grove's Student Services Dept. provides academic planning support, personal social guidance, and college and career advising for all students through classroom delivery models, individuals counseling sessions and group formats, EGHS counselors deliver a comprehensive, data driven school counseling program that creates an exemplary educational environment for all EG students.

In the 2017-18 academic year, D214 shifted from a 5.0 GPA to a 4.0 GPA scale.

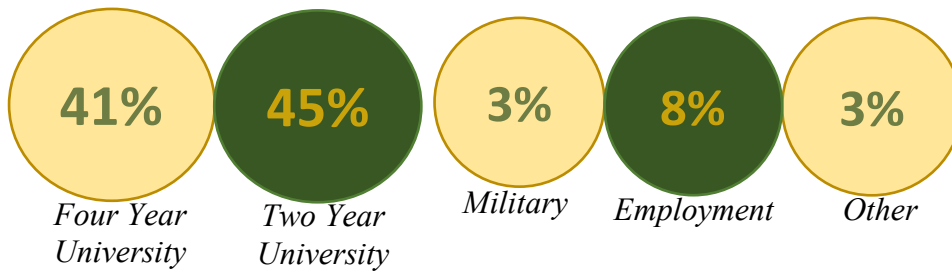
